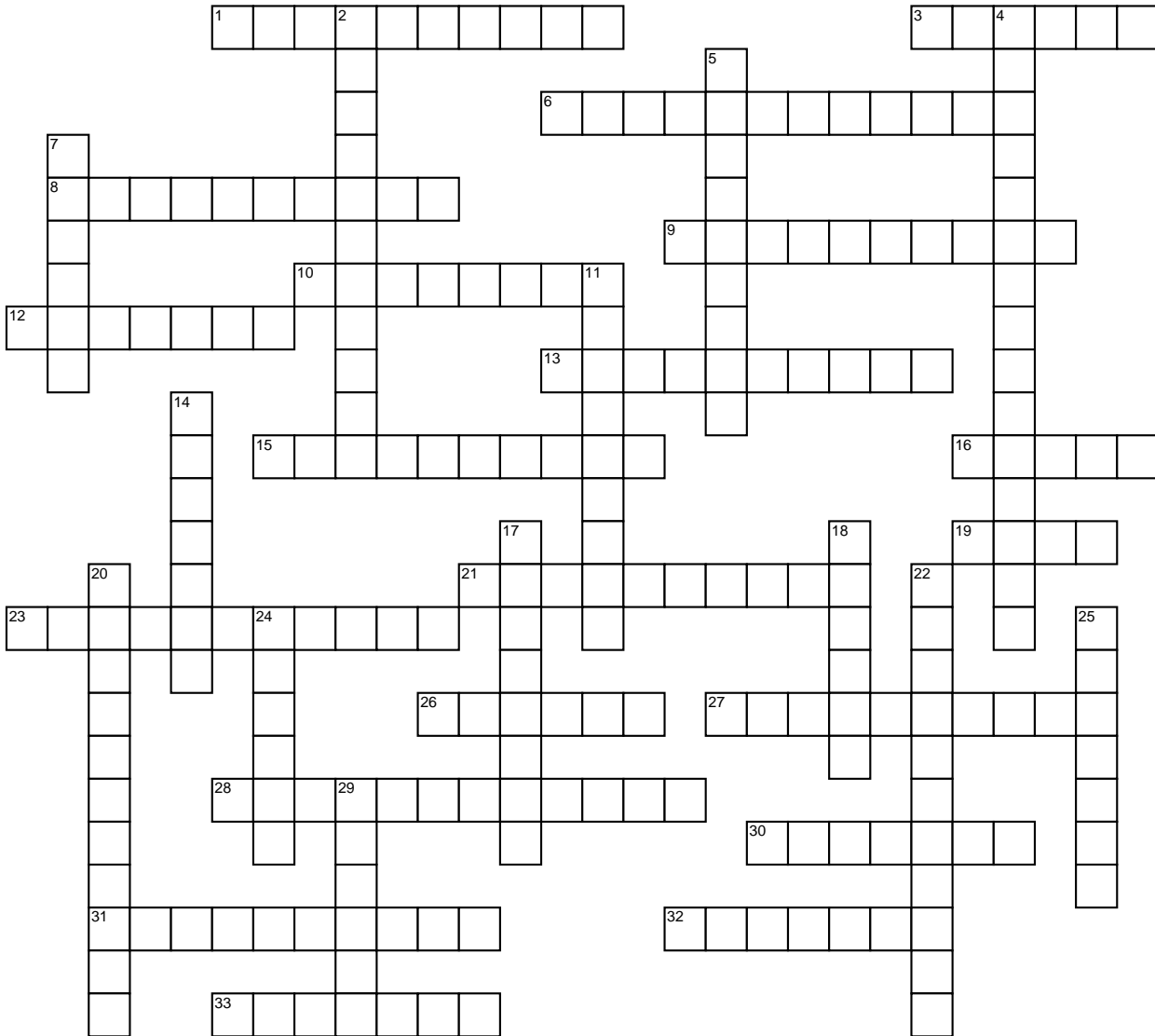

- 28 this activity, to promote business competition and limit monopolies, was a key facet of the Progressive movement
- 30 author of the 'The History of the Standard Oil Company' which highlighted the ruthlessness of John Rockefeller's business

- 31 Wisconsin Progressive governor who targeted reforming the practices of the railroad industry
- 32 the \_\_\_ Antitrust Act of 1890 was aimed at limiting the power of big business
- 33 the \_\_\_ Antitrust Act of 1914 aimed at protecting fair trade and business competition

- 2 Progressive movement to ban alcoholic beverages in order to improve moral behavior

- 4 One of Roosevelt's greater success was found in this, as protecting wilderness areas for public good
- 5 the Pure Food and Drug Act was passed in 1906 to protect these
- 7 Progressive U.S. President associated with creation of the Federal Reserve system, the Federal Trade Commission, and passage of the Clayton Antitrust Act
- 11 Progressive U.S. President who favored government regulation of business
- 14 this group largely supported the views of the Populist party
- 17 one of the 'third political parties' that focused on advancing farmers' interests in government affairs
- 18 Illinois Progressive leader who advocated for improving lives of women and children, and secured passage of the 1893 Illinois Factory Act
- 20 Industrialist who was associated with the issues that Progressives wanted to reform
- 22 this Amendment allowed for the direct public election of senators to the U.S. government
- 24 the \_\_\_ Deal referred to Roosevelt's endorsement of various Progressive reforms
- 25 Labor leader who worked to build unions and improve pay for workers
- 29 the Triangle Shirtwaist Company fire of 1911 led to reforms to protect worker \_\_\_
